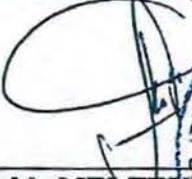

**Citizenship (Real Estate Option) Regulation
Order No. 115 of 2015**

In exercise of the powers conferred on me by subsection 13C(1) of the Citizenship Act [CAP 112], I, the Honourable MELTEK SATO KIMAN LIVTUVANU Prime Minister, make the following Regulation.

This Regulation commences on the day on which it is made.

**Citizenship (Real Estate Option) Regulation
Order No. 115 of 2015**

Arrangement of Sections

1 Interpretation

Act means the Citizenship Act [CAP 112];

Capital Investment Immigration Plan, means a plan whereby a foreign investor is to be entitled to be granted citizenship under section 13C of the Act;

Class 12C Residence Visa means a residence visa granted to a foreign investor pursuant to Item 12C of Table 2 in Schedule 1 of the Immigration Visa Regulation;

Immigration Visa Regulation means the Immigration Visa Regulation Order No.180 of 2011;

Real Estate Option means the program set out in the Schedule;

Real Estate Option Authorised Agent means Vanuatu Migration Services Limited;

Vanuatu Government Approved Project means a project or development which:

- (a) has met the applicable requirement under the Schedule; and

-
- (b) which has been approved by the Council of Ministers as suitable for investment for the purposes of the Real Estate Option.

2 Requirements for application for citizenship under subsection 13C(1) of the Act

- (1) For the purposes of section 13C(1) of the Act, the requirements for an application for citizenship by an investor under the Capital Investment Immigration Plan for the Real Estate Option Program are as follows:
 - (a) the applicant has been issued with a valid Class 12C Residence Visa; and
 - (b) the applicant must have been granted the approval of the Prime Minister or the Prime Minister's delegate under subclause 3(3).
- (2) To avoid doubt, an applicant under subclause (1) must still comply with any other applicable requirement of the Act and any other applicable law of the Republic of Vanuatu..

3 Real Estate Option Program

- (1) For the purposes of subclause 2(1)(b), a foreign investor must apply to the Prime Minister or the Prime Minister's delegate for approval as an "investor" under the Real Estate Option.
- (2) An application under subclause (1) must:
 - (a) be made in writing;
 - (b) be submitted through the Real Estate Option Authorised Agent;
 - (c) attach all other relevant documentation required by the Real Estate Option Authorised Agent;
 - (d) include all receipts or other evidence showing payment of all fees and other amounts prescribed by the Schedule; and
 - (e) include a signed statement from the applicant and, if applicable, the applicant's spouse, and any dependents of the applicant over the age of 18 years, which states that that person will comply with:
 - (i) the Citizenship Act; and

-
- (ii) the conditions of the Real Estate Option for a period of ten years from the date of grant of citizenship under this Regulation.
- (3) The Prime Minister or Prime Minister's delegate may grant his or her approval that the applicant under subclause (2) is an "investor" under the Real Estate Option if satisfied that the applicant:
- (a) has met all the qualifications and criteria under the Schedule; and
 - (b) has no criminal record in either the country or his or her nationality or (if different) the country of his or her residence; and
 - (c) is a person of good moral standing (character);
 - (d) is financially sound; and
 - (e) has demonstrated that the source of the funds in payment of the Investment Amount and Fees as prescribed by the Schedule is legitimate.

SCHEDULE

REAL ESTATE OPTION

1 Introduction

The government of the Republic of Vanuatu recognises the potential for mutual benefit to be derived from implementing the Real Estate Option in particular with the development of tourism and other related infrastructure in Vanuatu and for that purpose has adopted the Real Estate Option and has appointed the Real Estate Option Authorised Agent as its exclusive agent.

This document sets out the criteria and conditions of the Real Estate Option.

2 The Benefits

Upon compliance with the criteria of the Real Estate Option and completion of all necessary due diligence investigations, an investor applicant and his or her spouse and one child under the age of 18, are eligible to be granted the following rights:

(a) Residence

The right to enter and reside in Vanuatu for a period of 10 years, such right being renewable, subject to continued compliance with the conditions of the Real Estate Option, for further periods of 5 years;

(b) Citizenship

The right to be granted citizenship of Vanuatu within a period of 3 months from the grant of a Real Estate Option residence permit upon complying with the conditions of:

- (i) paragraph 13C(1) of the Act; and
- (ii) the conditions set out in this Schedule.

3 Conditions of Qualification

To qualify for the above benefits prescribed by clause 2, the applicant must fulfil each of the following conditions:

(a) Application

An applicant under the Real Estate Option, must submit their application to the Real Estate Option Authorised Agent.

(b) Investment

- (i) to be a qualifying investment under the Real Estate Option, the applicant must enter into contract which:
 - (A) is for the purchase by the applicant of an existing or proposed lot in a strata title scheme, which lot or scheme is included within a Vanuatu Government Approved Project; and
 - (A) is unconditional, other than conditional upon acceptance by the Vanuatu Government of the applicant's Application under the Schedule; and
 - (B) has a contract price of at least USD\$250,000 ("the Investment Amount");
- (ii) an applicant must pay the entire purchase price for the lot, together with the relevant registration and transfer fees, as required by clause 13 of this Schedule.

(c) Fees

- (i) The applicant must pay the following fees to the Vanuatu Government in addition to making the above investment prescribed by paragraph (b) above:
 - (A) US\$52,000 – payable to the Vanuatu Government upon making the application;
 - (B) US\$10,000 – payable to the Vanuatu Government on the grant of citizenship to the applicant; and
 - (C) US\$300 – payable to the Vanuatu Government upon the issuance of a Vanuatu passport to the applicant; and
- (ii) the applicant, with respect to additional children and dependents, must pay the following fees:

- (A) US\$500 – for each child under the age of 18 at the time of application; and
- (B) US\$5,000 – for any other qualifying additional dependent.

(d) Processing Fee

The applicant must pay the relevant processing fees as required from time to time by the Real Estate Option Authorised Agent.

The Real Estate Option Authorised Agent must certify to the Vanuatu Government that all processing fees have been paid by the applicant.

(e) Expedition Fee

If the applicant wishes to be granted citizenship within 1 month from the grant of the residence permit, the applicant must pay an expedition fee of US\$5,000 to the Vanuatu Government.

(f) Residence

Upon satisfying the conditions of paragraphs 3(a) to (d) above, the applicant, the applicant's spouse, and one child of the applicant under the age of 18 years at the time of application, are eligible to be granted a residence permit.

The applicant must be physically resident in Vanuatu for an aggregate period of not less than 30 days at some time between the date of grant of the residence permit and 120 months following the grant of citizenship.

(g) Qualifying Investment must be new property and be retained for Five Years

- (i) A lot in a strata scheme that has been purchased by an applicant, and which has qualified that applicant for citizenship under the Real Estate Option, must not be sold or otherwise disposed of by the applicant for a period of at least five (5) years after the granting of citizenship to the applicant.

- (ii) A lot that has previously been used by an applicant under this scheme shall not be eligible to be used for subsequent applications for citizenship under the Real Estate Option.

(h) Oath of Allegiance

The applicant, the applicant's spouse, and any additional dependent of the applicant under sub-paragraph 4(a)(i) and (ii), seeking the grant of citizenship pursuant to an application made by the applicant under the Real Estate Option must take and subscribe to an oath of allegiance or make a solemn affirmation in the form set out in the Act.

4 Additional Dependents

- (a) An applicant may obtain approval for grant of Residency under the Immigration Visa Regulation No. 180 of 2011 and Citizenship under this Schedule for additional dependent persons, provided that:
 - (i) the additional persons are lineal descendants aged 18 to 25 years, or under, or ascendants of the main applicant and or the spouse of the applicant;
 - (ii) the additional persons are financially supported and dependent upon the main applicant or the spouse of the main applicant;
 - (iii) the applicant pays the fees prescribed in paragraph 3(c)(ii) for the additional persons.
- (b) any additional dependents will be entitled to the benefits in Section 2 of this Schedule.

5 Timing of Payments

The timing of payment of the above mentioned sums will be as follows:

- (a) upon written notification of acceptance by the Real Estate Option Authorised Agent of the application, 25% of the fees detailed at

paragraphs 3(c) and (d) above, together with the fee prescribed by paragraph 3(e) above, if applicable; and

- (b) upon issue of an Approval Letter in relation to the application by the Real Estate Option Authorised Agent the balance of the fees prescribed at paragraphs 3(c) and (d) together with the Investment Amount detailed at section 3(b) of this Schedule above as well as the Stamp Duty and Transfer fees payable on the transfer of the lot.

6 Marketing agents

- (a) The Real Estate Option Authorised Agent may appoint a marketing agent ("Marketing Agent") as a subagent of the Real Estate Option Authorised Agent.
- (b) Marketing Agents may charge a fee for their ancillary services, which fee will be included in the fees, which an applicant must pay to the Real Estate Option Authorised Agent.

7 Investment

The investment: A real estate project comprised of apartments and/ or condominiums (constructed or under construction) as approved by the Vanuatu Government. Sale of vacant land will not qualify as an investment under the Real Estate Option.

8 Limitations

The category of citizenship granted to applicants will be full citizenship, not economic citizenship or any other category different from that enjoyed by native- born citizens. The grant of Citizenship however is subject to the conditions imposed in the Act.

9 Refund

Where an application is refused:

- (a) for matters beyond or outside of the control of the applicant the fees paid by the applicant are to be refunded to the applicant.
- (b) on account of any false declaration or documents provided by the applicant there will be no refund of fees being paid by the applicant.

10 Confidentiality

- (a) Any person who, except when required by a court of competent jurisdiction, with respect to any company otherwise than for the purposes of the administration of the Citizenship Act and/or the Immigration Act in Vanuatu or elsewhere, divulges, attempts, offers or threatens to divulge or induces or attempts to induce other persons to divulge any information concerning or respecting in any way the REO program, including but not limited to any application made under the REO Program, shall be guilty of an offence.
- (b) Any person who contravenes subclause (b) shall, on conviction, be liable to a fine not exceeding US\$100,000 or to imprisonment for a term not exceeding 5 years or to both such fine and imprisonment
- (c) Subclauses (a) and (b) above do not apply to the REO Authorised Agent, the Marketing Agent, or to any employee of the Vanuatu Government carrying out a lawful and authorised function under this Regulation or the Citizenship Act.

11 Vanuatu Government Approved Project

For a development or project to achieve the status as a Vanuatu Government Approved Project, the following criteria must be met:

- (a) the Major Investor must have demonstrated financial capacity to complete the Project; and
- (b) the Project must:
 - (i) contribute to a substantial extent to the growth of the Vanuatu Economy by:
 - (A) providing significant new employment in Vanuatu; and
 - (B) expanding Vanuatu's infrastructure network and services including without limitation electricity,

water, road and telephones within the area surrounding the Project;

- (ii) be of high quality in terms of appearance, amenity and the nature and quality of facilities provided;
 - (iii) provide for a system of ongoing management and caretaking of the roads, lands and facilities contained within the Project (as well as roads providing access to the Project) to the extent that they are maintained to a high standard in perpetuity in a manner that does not adversely impact upon the finances of the Vanuatu Government or the relevant municipal and/or provincial councils;
 - (iv) involve the construction of apartment and/or hotel accommodation with the title registered under the Strata Titles Act [CAP 266] which must be operated and used for tourism purposes as a resort, hotel or holiday accommodation;
 - (v) not involve the sale of vacant land.
 - (vi) comply with all the requirements for development within the relevant municipal or provincial areas in which the project is located.
 - (vii) not negatively impact on the values and lifestyle of ni-Vanuatu citizens in any way.
 - (viii) in addition to any land rent, must pay an additional amount of 2% of the gross revenue derived from all income producing activity (turnover rent) to the custom land owners of the land on which the Project is situated.
- (c) To avoid doubt, the Major Investor under the Vanuatu Government Approved Project must comply with any other applicable requirement of the Act or any other applicable law of the Republic of Vanuatu.

12 Payment of Purchase Price of Lot

- (a) If strata lot which the applicant has contracted to purchase is a prospective lot in a strata title scheme, or is not yet constructed (the "Lot"):
 - (i) the full purchase price for the Lot is to be paid to a trust account maintained by a suitably qualified and licensed professional Solicitor or Accountant as approved by the Prime Minister; and
 - (ii) the major investor (as the developer of the Lot) will be entitled to draw down the funds from the account as each stage of the construction is completed with the amounts to be agreed between the Prime Minister and the Major Investor.
- (b) if the Lot is constructed and the title for the Lot has been registered under the Strata Title Act [CAP 266] the full purchase price is to be paid to the Major Investor.
- (c) An Applicant is also required to pay the Vanuatu Government the relevant stamp duty and registration fees payable on the transfer for the Lot.

- (9) An applicant under subclause (8) must include in his or her application to the Director of the Vanuatu Immigration Services:
- (a) a copy of a contract (the "Contract") which:
 - (i) is for the purchase by the applicant of an existing or proposed lot in a strata title scheme, which lot or scheme is included within a Vanuatu Government Approved Project as defined in the Citizenship (Real Estate Option) Regulation; and
 - (ii) is unconditional, other than conditional upon acceptance by the Vanuatu Government of the applicant's application under the Schedule in the Citizenship (Real Estate Option) Regulation;
 - (iii) has a contract price of at least USD\$250,000 ("the Investment Amount"); and
 - (b) receipt or other evidence showing payment of the Investment Amount payable under the Contract;
 - (c) a letter of undertaking certified by an officer designated by order of the Prime Minister, which states that the Applicant agrees to comply with the requirements of the Citizenship (Real Estate Option) Regulation; and

- (d) a receipt for the required fees payable to the Vanuatu Government as detailed in paragraphs 3(c), 3(e) (if applicable) and 12(c) of the Schedule to the Citizenship (Real Estate Option) Regulation; and
 - (e) the receipt showing payment of the fee payable under Item 12C in Table 2 of Schedule 1 of this Order; and
 - (f) a written acknowledgement from the Real Estate Option Authorised Agent, that the Processing Fee prescribed by paragraph 3(d) of the Schedule to the Citizenship (Real Estate Option) Regulation has been paid.
- (10) The Director of Immigration Services may issue the applicant with the Resident Visa under Item 12C in Table 2 of Schedule 1 if he or she is satisfied that the applicant has met all the requirements in subclause (9).
