Agriculture sector

Kava, spices, pepper, vanilla, cocoa and coconut are some of the key cash products that are part of the Vanuatu's export market and are being produced in Penama province. Kava and copra are two of the main export products and key income for the people of Penama province. Cocoa production is highly encouraged with the need for value addition. The opportunity for the commercial processing of root crops and nuts has also been identified in terms of improving its capacity.

Local knowledge in farming techniques and basic skills exists within the local farmers however investment in technology for processing purposes is key and an opportunity for investors.

Continued support programs for skills improvement and development is carried out by TVET programs and also encouraged through policies within the provincial government and relative departments including the agriculture department in the province.

Tourism

Penama province is home to some of Vanuatu's unique natural tourist attractions coupled with its stronghold in traditional customary beliefs and practises. This is a perfect combination for any investor venturing into the tourism sector in terms of establishing tourist accommodations and creating linkages with the locals for tours and sightseeing.

Regular flights to the islands of Penama and cruise ship visits to the island of Pentecost for the nangol land dive ensure continued growth for the tourism sector of Penama province.

Maewo Island receives the highest amount of rainfall in Vanuatu each year and hosts beautiful lush green vegetation and majestic waterfalls. It is an island set in kastom magic traditions therefore promising a wonderful experience for tourists and local alike.

Agro-business

Copra and Cattle – Sanma Province remains Vanuatu's powerhouse for copra and cattle production. Espiritu Santo, Malo and Aore are well known from history as hosts to Foreign-owned coconut

plantations and cattle farms. They still are and they are responsible for the bulk of Vanuatu's principal domestic exports. For example in 2014, copra and coconut oil contributed 79 percent of total domestic exports while exports of beef veal increased 44 percent over the previous year.

Authorities of the Sanma Province, key business players and community leaders are aggressively pursuing Government's Overarching Primary Sector Policy for increased production and quality of high valued products. Replanting of coconuts and introducing of new cattle breed will see increased productivity from existing commercial farms. As part of this development, small-holder farmers from nearby communities are also included with support from these commercial farms by supplying them with coconuts and cattle including capacity building programs.

But you also have the **virgin forests for timber** and related products and **sandalwood products**. Sanma Province hosts Vanuatu's main research centres and project sites aimed at expanding the country's production capacity in forest products.

Cocoa - with current average export quantity of 1,500 tonnes per year (2010-2015) and Sanma Province the main supplier, there is excellent potential for increased production of this product. The availability of land coupled with soils and climatic conditions suitable for cocoa beans, Sanma Province offers great investment opportunities for this product.

Small to Medium Scale Value addition Industries

With the only province having the abundance of land area for potential developments, establishing small to medium scale processing industries, Espiritu Santo offers the best location for this purpose.

Vanuatu Economic/Industrial zone – The first ever industrial zone for Vanuatu will be hosted by the Sanma Province. Progress is underway in this development; the site has been identified, sub-divisions of the site is already completed, essential services have commenced and launching of the project by the Government soon.

The intention of this initiative is to facilitate integrated farming systems (production, harvesting (post-harvest), processing and marketing.

Timber Processing Factory – being the hub of the country's Northern Province, a timber factory located at the province can buy timber products from the surrounding islands. With Santo being the biggest producer and supply of high yield forest products, Sanma Province offers the best location for the establishment of a timber processing plant.

Other small to medium scale value addition industries with potential in the Sanma Province include but not limited to:

- Virgin coconut oil manufacturing
 - Water bottling
 - Coffee Industry

Tourism

Tourism developments in the Sanma Province may not be of the same pace as in the Shefa Province, but has huge potential for the industry to expand. Excellent sites for 4-5 star resorts and hotels targeting high-end markets remain untapped and combined with improved infrastructure, Sanma Province can become Vanuatu's best hot spot for tourism.

While progress is underway in developing 15 plus rooms boutique type bungalows, negotiations with international brand hotels (Warwick and IHG) for major resorts with 150 rooms are also taking place.

Average number of visitors to Sanma Province is 600 per month with trends showing strong growth potential in the medium to long term.

Based on a tourism market-gap analysis, the following tourism accommodation options have been identified:

- Boutique site x 5
- Resort style with conference facilities
- Business/leisure hotel
- Luganville, 4 star family based resort

Having the largest province in terms of land mass (1/3rd of Vanuatu's landmass), it has the potential to accommodate a wide range of investment activities. Especially large scale investment with a strong focus in primary production for value addition for export can be assured to be well accommodated.

As an American base during the 2nd world war, stories and historical sites provide some of the best tourism attractions in the pacific region. The unlimited landscape provides excellent opportunities for the tourism industry.

The improvement of government support services through existing institutions and other authorities will enable established industries to expand and attract new business and investment.



Has the longest road networks in the country

Claiming the longest road networks in Vanuatu means despite the location of your investment in the province, your products and services are guaranteed of reaching their final destination for consumer needs.

The tar-sealed road to the Eastern part of Santo have contributed to the success of businesses current undertaking activities outside of Luganville. Recent plans to improve road networks to the southern part of the island see more developments in this part of the island.

The existing road networks provide easy and quick access to current government and donor-funded projects in the remote parts of the province, especially in the primary sector (Livestock and Forestry). Further expansion of existing projects or developing new production supply project sites in the remote areas of the province will see further extension of existing road networks, thereby making Sanma Province a favourable location to do business.



Host to one of the best and longest wharf in the pacific

The recent completion of a close to 300 meters long wharf on Santo will make Sanma Province a gateway to international multi-purpose vessels. While this facility will enhance Sanma's exporting ability, other potential business activities are abundant.

Vanuatu's cruise tourism industry is booming and current trends have indicated that the likelihood of this maintain an upward trend. The wharf facility will see many more cruise ships berthing in Sanma, thus enabling more tourism business opportunities.



A hub for the northern islands and provinces

Sanma Province has once been recognised as a base for foreign fishing vessels, boatbuilding and marine engineering with a strong focus on heavier engineering repairs and offloading of tuna fishes caught in the Vanuatu waters. It is well positioned to capitalise on foreign vessels fishing under Vanuatu Government License. The demand for import substitution by local value added products,

particularly marine products will enable the fishing industry to expand and attract new business and investment in the province.

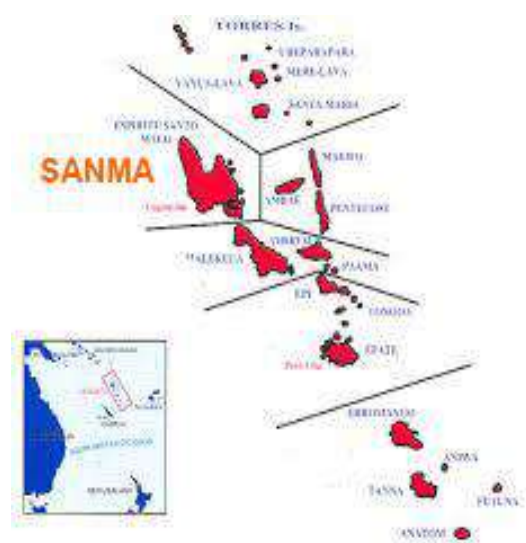
Sanma province's strategic location has been and remains important in terms of trading with the northern provinces, namely Penama, Torba and Malampa. As the country's main export base, Santo is the principal market for products from the 3 provinces.

The Pekoa International airport will be upgraded to cater for bigger international air crafts. This is mean spill over effects to the other province from the tourism growth in the Sanma Province looks very promising.

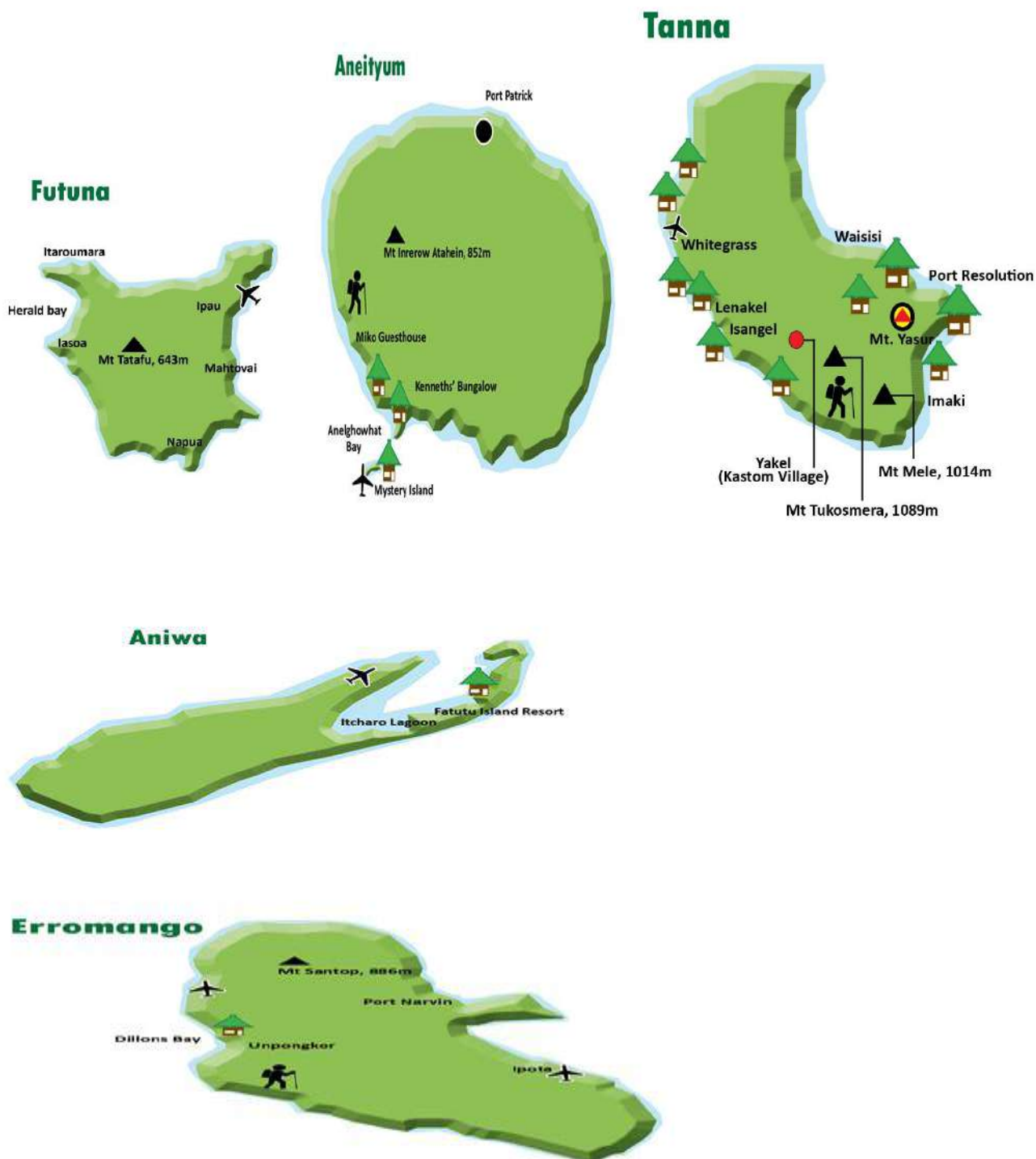

TAFEA PROVINCE



“Decentralization policy is implemented, the people will enjoy the developments through the people’s requests”

Tafea Province has a population of 37,050. TAFEA is one of the six provinces of Vanuatu. TAFEA is the southernmost province of Vanuatu. The name is an acronym for the five islands that make up the province Tanna, Aneityum (also Anatom), Futuna, Erromango and Aniwa. Tanna is where you can walk up the most accessible Live Volcano in the world. It is also Vanuatu’s third most developed Island. Tanna's economy is based primarily on Agriculture and Tourism. Tanna's main town is Lenakel although the administrative centre is nearby Isangel.

Aneityum is a tropical Island paradise and is Vanuatu's southernmost inhabited island. The interior is mountainous and covered with wet, dark forest. Along the coast, pine plantations contrast with coconut palms, white sand beaches and second largest coral reef system in Vanuatu. Aneityum is a good island for walking, not too large and with a cooler climate. Mystery Island is all beaches and reefs and a popular cruise ship destination especially large Carnival Cruise line.

Futuna is an Island in the Tafea Province. It is the easternmost Island in the country. It was formed by the uplift of an underwater volcano, which last erupted at least 11,000 years ago. It reaches a height of 666 m. It is sometimes called West Futuna to distinguish it from Futuna Island, Wallis and Futuna. It is a Polynesian outlier.

Erromango is the largest island in Tafea, the southernmost province of Vanuatu. Its largest villages are Port Narvin and Dillon’s Bay (Upongkor). Erromango is largely unpopulated and undeveloped. Since early 1800s people have been buying, trading and stealing sandalwood from Erromango to take to other countries for processing to essential oil for perfumes and other products. For the first time ever sandalwood oil has been produced on the sandalwood rich island of Erromango. Upongkor village, eight kilometers south of Dillon's Bay airstrip, has the island's only guest house. Erromango is also renowned for its forest resources including abundance of wild game and hardwood forests.

Aniwa is a raised coral atoll 24 km NE of Tanna Island in the Tafea Province. The highest point is only 42m above sea level. Most of the island's residents live in the south. Aniwa was the first island in the archipelago to have missionaries. The lagoon has become a new addition to the Vanuatu Ocean Swim 2010 event. Long beach walks on the secluded lagoon are a feature of your stay on Aniwa - guides are available to point out plants, shells and fish indigenous to the island. They will also take you to the newly created Turtle Sanctuary.

Agro-Business

Tafea Province is rich with Agriculture crops, particularly high value crops such as Coffee planting, Coconut, Kava, Citrus, Noni spices and root crops and root crops. The Islands within Tafea Province are popular based on the value crops planted by the people. Tanna Island is famously known for its Tanna Coffee which grown under the shadows of the still active Yasur Volcano. It is the active Volcano's influence that makes the Tanna Coffee so unique. The deep, rich soils, abundant sunshine and plentiful rainfall are the very essence of this truly natural and excellent product. Traditionally Tanna is also well known for its fertile soil where it's hard working population farm peanut, potato, onion, carrot, round cabbage, lettuce, tomato and capsicum. On the other hand, Erromango Island is well for its Sandalwood which later process into essential oil for perfumes and other products. Fishing activities on the Island of Aniwa play an important role in maintaining the supply of seafood protein for the communities. Both men and women are active fishers, contributing to the household fish consumption and profitable purpose. The Government encouraged local businessmen to joint-partnerships with foreign investors and create local industry associations depending on the require policy and agreement under the sector responsible.



Opportunities in Livestock

Vanuatu beef is considered one of the best in the world. Cattle farming is a great opportunity in Tafea Province. The Government of Vanuatu implemented the National Cattle Restocking Program supporting all province for this initiative business platform supporting small scale farmers. This will contribute towards the Government's national target to register a total of 500,000 heads of cattle by 2025. The Island of Tanna, Erromango and Aneityum have been register cattle restocking program with high potential. The importance of the distribution of improved herds to rural farmers means that in the future, people expect heavier and meaty cattle on rural plantations to maintain a high quality of organic beef at all times.



Timber Business

Timber is popular in the Tafea Province meaning there is a high value especially in Sandalwood. Vanuatu's own Erromango sandalwood is committed to improving the livelihoods of farmers, landholders & communities through sustainable production and value adding of essential timber. The Government of Vanuatu support local communities by distributing Sawmills, particularly in the Tafea Province. With records indicating that there some 1,400 hectares of woodlot established in Tafea Province. The current activity for forestry investment in Tafea Province is the Sandalwood Joint Ventures, under the name of Erromango Sandalwood Limited. This business activity involves Joint Ventures with Sandalwood growers on Erromango Island and Foreign Investor from New Zealand. The Joint Ventures were initially established under the Sandalwood futures then moved to Erromango Sandalwood Limited. This initiative provide a platform for local Sandalwood growers to have the opportunity to sell their sandalwood to any foreign investor who is interested in conducting business in this particular category.



Invest in Eco-Tourism

Tourism is the main source of income in Tafea Province. Tanna Island received the highest number of visitors due to its Toka ceremony is considered the most impressive traditional dance. It is held every 3 to 4 years. This includes Tanna's most famous attraction and is regarded as the world's most accessible active volcano. Over the centuries, ash rain from Yasur has built up huge black sand dunes, creating a stark moonscape. With routes road where visitors can climb up to the crater rim, where they are treated to a magnificent fireworks display. Eco-Bungalows built in line to support the surrounded natural environment and traditional cultures perform by local communities to welcome visitors. Tanna has a variety of Accommodations from luxury variety to smaller traditional style Island Bungalows located throughout the Island with the majority found close to the Volcano for easy access to visit the Volcano. The adventure begin once you landed in Tanna and with its unique cultural experience, visitors can choice where to stay.

Mystery Island is an uninhabited Island and is 10 minutes away by boat from the big Island called Aneityum situated in Tafea Province. The Island itself has remained virtually untouched. This incredibly beautiful conglomeration of pure white sand, palm trees and coral reefs provides the perfect place to relax and unwind. Mystery Island can be reach only via Cruises ships, local boats and by planes (Air Vanuatu) 3 times a week. This is one stop journey for everyone to enjoy local foods, local coconuts, local coffee and taste of cooked spiny lobster. The surrounding areas from Mystery Island has been secured as a Marine Protected Area. However, there are other hidden investment opportunity apart from spending time in sand and cave snorkelling, ship wrecks, turtle touching and fish feeding surrounded by clear blue waters and sheltered by coral reefs.

WHITEGRASS AIRPORT

White Grass Airport is Vanuatu's third international Airport and is owned and operated by Airports Vanuatu Limited (AVL). White Grass Airport is under the responsibility of Airports Vanuatu Limited (AVL) Operations and has an Airport Manager that ensures Civil Aviation Rule are in compliance at all times. This is a good investment opportunity especially having both companies registered as local business enterprise and with its own shareholders and providing genuine service to the people of Tafea. Infrastructure plays an important role in regards to the recent upgrade of the terminal. The terminal provide easy accessible route for foreign investors with a lot to choice from when it comes to investment opportunity.



LOCAL BUSINESS SERVICE

Tafea Province continues to receive supports from the Government and Private Companies for better services allocated to the people and communities. There are two Commercial Banks on Tanna. National Bank of Vanuatu and Bank South Pacific (BSP). Other business household name includes Western Union, Post Office and Air Vanuatu. The two biggest Telecommunication companies which is DIGIGEL and TVL are the main communication which office located in Tanna Island and coverage through reaching other Islands in Tafea Province. However, with high increasing number of visitors to Tafea Province by yachts and plane, Customs and Immigration Office is also located in Lenakel Town. Travel by domestic shipping, the main port is at Lenakel and this includes outer islands within Tafea Province.



UNELCO EXTENSION

It has been a great achievement for the people of Tanna and Tafea province to officially witness for the first time, lights being switched on at White grass

Airport as one of the major development conducted by Unelco. Electricity & Power Unelco provides electricity throughout the town of Lenakel and some rural areas closer to town. Most remote villages and Bungalows run on generator or solar power and may be switched off at night.



ROCKWATER RESORT

With its overlooking view pointing directly to the Pacific Ocean, Rockwater Resort is simply one of kind crafted out of the limestone cliffs of the stunningly beautiful, undiscovered North Tanna coastline. Three years of labour with handmade bricks fully style with Mediterranean restaurant along with coral gardens, overlooking sunsets, Rockwater Resort surely is breathtaking. The Resort is built for a purpose and that is to attract visitors to the Island of Tanna. Rockwater Resort opened its doors on the 4th of April 2018. Whilst embracing the location's natural environment in its architecture, Rockwater also introduced a new level of guests comforts and leisure in the southern islands of Vanuatu. Employment opportunity is definitely a must were locals recruited to work at Rockwater Resort.



PACIFIC ENERGY

With three fuel stations opened at Louanatom and two in Lenakel, Pacific Energy is already seeing beyond the horizon of economic beacon that is beckoning both locals and foreigners to partner to develop Tanna, by assuring the people that depending on the current positive economic climate, they may open more fuel station on Tanna in near future. The cost of fuel on Tanna is now the same as in Port Vila supporting communities in Tanna and other Islands in Tafea Province. The three fuel stations are owned 100% by indigenous Tanna owners and their families. This clearly shows the interest of small and medium enterprise in

partnership with its supplier for implementing the Government's Energy Road Map by setting up business on Tanna.



TANNA COFFEE

With its famously high value coffee production, Tanna Island continuously set standard when it comes to business endeavours. Established in Tanna in 1982, Tanna Coffee Development Company operate to assist Vanuatu after its Independence. Due to severe climatic conditions, the company stop operating until it was sold to a private investors, who later introduced stronger varieties. With high rich volcanic soils, Arabic Coffee is genuinely the consumer type and natural quality product for its investment. Production from over 750 farmers has increased which lead to earning capacity and provide accessible for oversea market. Approximately 500,000 coffee trees have been on Tanna and 100,000 planted on other adjoining Islands. The aim of creating a viable and sustainable industry capable of satisfying international demands will continue but more importantly maintaining the unique quality that the 100% organically grown Tanna coffee possesses. All coffee is sold in roasted and packaged form through Tanna Coffee's facility which locate in Port Vila with 70% being distributed locally and is currently exporting to Australia, New Zealand and Fiji and supplies seedlings to two certified organic coffee growers in Samoa. This is a milestone for Vanuatu local product to be recognised in International Market and also encouraging farmers throughout the country to make use of their land.

Areas of opportunity

Tourism

Ecotourism – Torba province is Vanuatu's northernmost province and is one of the few islands that remains untouched by foreign influence. Many of its islands feature the idyllic tourism destination setting of white sandy beaches set against a lush vegetation backdrop with clear crystal blue waters. The potential to host an ecotourism project on any of the province's big islands is key in the Torba Tourism Plan with established natural attractions such as the Lake Letas and Siri Waterfalls on Gaua Island. Special importance is given towards ecotourism projects by the Torba Provincial Council in its Tourism Plan to uphold the beauty and natural state of its unique attractions.

Continued flight regularity to the province signals positive development in the tourism sector that should encourage and uphold tourist visits both by air and through yachts.

A local Tourism Association established by local business men and women involved in the tourism industry is assurance of the skills and know how available in the province. Further development through upgrade of any accommodation type would be an exciting opportunity for any investor.

Fisheries

Owning Vanuatu's largest marine boundary Torba province has great potential in the fisheries sector. The aquaculture industry is a source of cash income for local fish farmers through farming of water fish such as tilapia and prawn. There is great room for an expansion of such a project due to its current market limited being to the local communities of Torba. Fresh water fish (tilapia) and prawn farming are two of the main aquaculture fish products farmed by the locals. Local skills and know how is readily available with a Torba Fisherman's Association already in place.

Renovation and construction of wharves and the setting up of processing plants are two key investments that will guarantee the major success in the fisheries sector from Torba Province. Market opportunities are available within the domestic market for supply due to the increased need for protein intake by locals. Vanuatu. Processed fish products also have the potential for the international markets of the Asian region.

Coconut industry

Although small in size and capacity in development of its current coconut sector, Torba Province produces a high number of copra compared to the country's provinces. Total value of production in 2007 showed that Torba Province alone produced 8,038,000VT worth of coconut produce. 20% of good agricultural land is used for planting coconut trees with great potential for replanting.

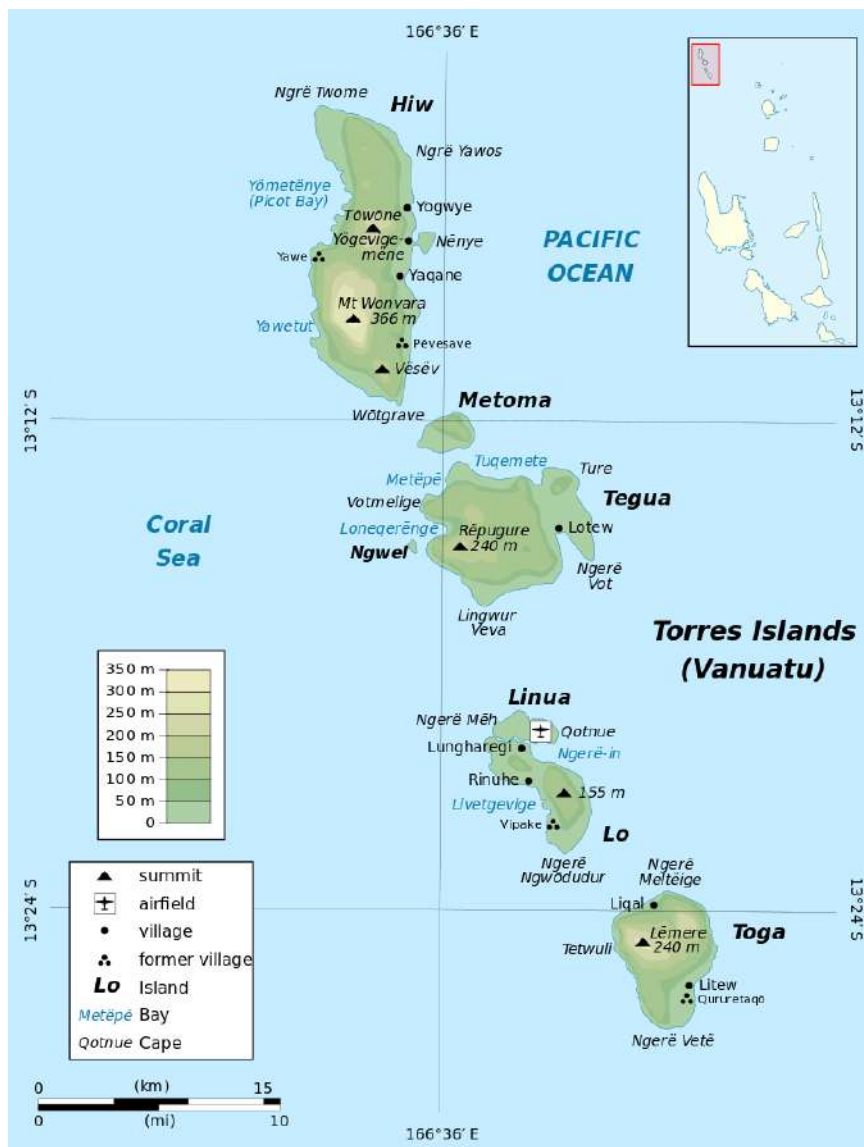

Any foreign investor with the vision for great development through available opportunities should look into Torba Province as a gold mine for investment potential and growth in the future.

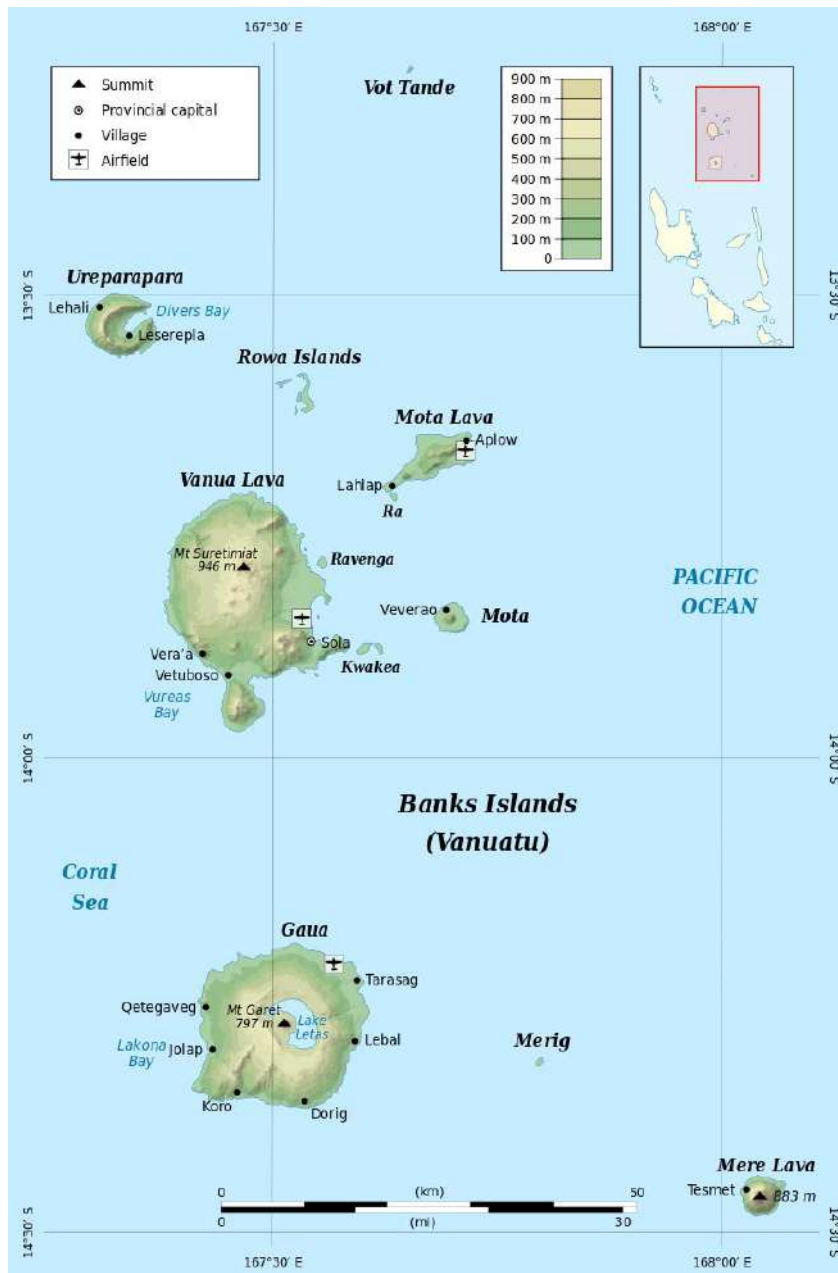
INVESTING IN A SAFE AND SECURE ENVIRONMENT
